



Greg Hockensmith going to the 2006 IPC Cycling World Championships



The best road and track paralympic riders meet from 8 to 18 September in Aigle, Switzerland, at the World Cycling Centre.

The International Paralympic Committee (IPC) Cycling World Championships will be held at the World Cycling Centre (WCC), headquarters of the International Cycling Union (UCI), in Aigle, Switzerland.

Some 300 athletes from around 40 countries will take part in road (road races and

time trials) and track (sprint, 500 metres, kilometre, pursuit) competitions, in the surroundings of Aigle and in the WCC velodrome.

Athletes will compete within one of the four groups of disability defined by the IPC: blind and visually impaired, cerebral palsy, locomotor disabilities and hand-cycling.

Greg Hockensmith, SureHands' Arizona/New Mexico representative, is a world champion handcyclist. He participated in the Athens paralympic games in 2004. He has qualified for the US team to defend his world championship title in Aigle.
